

### **Veterans' admission policies at LCC**

Lamar Community College cooperates with the Veterans Administration and with the Colorado State Approving Agency for Veterans Education and Training. The College is approved for training of veterans under all applicable laws. Veterans or eligible persons are cautioned to obtain proper counseling and to complete proper registration at the College to assure their courses of study are approved curricula.

Every veteran or eligible person should coordinate counseling and registration through the Veterans Affairs Coordinator in the Financial Aid Office. All students receiving education aid through the Veterans Administration should carefully read this section and seek clarification if in doubt about the contents or regulations.

Veterans must meet all College requirements as detailed elsewhere in this bulletin before becoming eligible for education assistance. Veterans should be prepared to finance their school and living expenses for at least sixty days. This is the estimated time required for the Veterans Administration Regional Office to process applications and arrange for assistance.

The refund policy of tuition and fees, room and board charges, and other charges for veterans is the same as the policy for other students. See Payments & Adjustments Section.

The College maintains a written record of applicable previous education and training of the veteran or eligible person and clearly indicates what appropriate credit the College has given.

The student may be given advanced standing and the training period shortened proportionately when credit has been recorded and reported. Such credit and standing will be reported to the Veterans Administration and to the student as recorded in the student's official school records.
