### ***THREE LCC SOPHOMORES SIGN LETTERS OF INTENT***

(Lamar, Colorado, December 10, 2004) Three sophomores from the Lamar Community College men's baseball team signed national letters of intent to play Division I Baseball on Wednesday, November 17, 2004. LCC Head Baseball Coach Scott Crampton announced that catcher Jesse Shriner has signed with the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers. Pitcher Seth Gilleland and third baseman Chad Steiner have committed to the University of Northern Colorado.

Shriner, a 6' 195 pound catcher from Bear Creek H.S. in Littleton, CO, signed with the University of Nebraska after batting .432 (95-for-220) with 10 home runs, 22 doubles and 82 RBIs last spring. In addition to leading the team in hits, batting average, doubles, triples, slugging percentage, on base average, and RBIs, Shriner was named first team All-American and first team All-Region. Shriner was also recruited by Texas A&M, Arizona State, and University of Southern California.

Steiner, a 5' 11" 195 pound third baseman from Arapahoe High School in Littleton, CO, is headed to Greeley to play for the University of Northern Colorado. The Bears begin their second year as a Division I baseball program. The hard-nosed Steiner started 56 games for the 'Lopes last year and batted .380 (70-for-184) with 8 home runs, 20 doubles and 57 RBIs. Chad was also named first team All-Region in 2004. Steiner was also recruited by Central Missouri, University of Texas Arlington, and University of Southern California.

Gilleland, a 6'4" 205 pound pitcher from Moriarty High School in Moriarty, NM has signed to play at the University of Northern Colorado as well. The commanding right-hander started eight games as a freshman and finished with a record of 8-2 and a 2.29 ERA. Seth struck out 58 batters in 51 innings pitched. As well as being selected second team All-Region, Gilleland was recruited by Central Missouri, University of New Mexico, and University of Southern California.

Since the 2000 season at LCC, thirty players have signed to play Division I baseball at schools such as Miami, Nebraska, Texas Tech, UNLV, Kansas, Kansas State, Utah, Missouri, New Mexico, Tulane, and Northern Colorado. His program has also had 18 more players sign to play Division II baseball.
