TURNER TESTS STUDENT KNOWLEDGE

(Lamar, Colorado; August 11, 2010) Lamar Community College Nursing Instructor Mary Ann Turner was selected and recently served as an item writer for the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Licensure Examination (NCLEX®). Turner was approved by the Colorado Board of Nursing and selected by the NCSBN to participate on the 2010 NCLEX® item development panel of subject matter experts that was held in Chicago. She was one of 12 nurses from across the nation to be selected for this assignment. Turner was nominated on the basis of clinical specialty and nursing expertise. The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN), headquartered in Chicago, IL, is responsible for developing and administering the NCLEX-RN® and NCLEX-PN® licensing exams.

Turner joined the LCC Nursing faculty in 2004 and completed her Masters in Nursing Education from Walden University. She teaches coursework in both Level I (LPN) and Level II (ADN/RN) of the LCC Nursing program.

All nurses in the United States and its four U.S. territories must take the NCLEX®. The licensing exams are designed to test candidate knowledge, skills and abilities essential to the safe and effective practice of nursing at the entry level. Passing the NCLEX® exam is one the requirements necessary for attaining a nursing license.
